










Tying CDC flies with natural Raffia Swiss Straw SwissR

Example: Moustique Joset Mouche de Mars (remake of the famous CDC of M Joset)

	
<p>Choose the color of raffia you want</p>	<p>Put a straw in a glass of water</p>
	
<p>Choose a CDC feather adapted to size of fly you want to make- do use little feathers for little flies Use only 1 feather per fly</p>	<p>Tear off a strip of raffia (1-2mm strip)</p>
	
<p>Make tail (must be long, 2x flybody, only 2-4 fibres), tie in CDC feather (cut off the too weak parts), tie in the raffia strip and ribbing and finish a nice underbody Underbody is white when making flies with light colored raffia</p>	<p>Finish body and ribbing- make a halfknot to secure</p>
	
<p>Wind CDC hackle carefully. leaving space for the head, finish head, make double final knot</p>	<p>Cut off too long CDC holding the fly between thumb and forefinger</p>
	
<p>The finished fly must have long tail and long CDC hackles, below the head as long as above</p>
